lorida is facing a significant opioid crisis that is impacting individuals from all economic and social backgrounds in both urban and rural communities. According to the Centers for Disease Control, the age-adjusted rate of drug overdose deaths in Florida still remains higher than the national average.

In 2018, Florida's death rate was 22.8 per 100,000 persons as compared to 20.7 opioid related deaths per 100,000 persons nationally.

The Florida AHEC Network is working to combat this epidemic by reducing the statewide morbidity and mortality associated with opioid use through interventions designed to prevent opioid misuse and strengthen the capacity of Florida's healthcare system to deliver early detection and appropriate treatment for those at risk.
